## Trail Sign

- "Caution" Road Crossing Ahead

Treadway  
3.0m min.

## Washroom

- permanent vault toilet or seasonal portable toilet
- locate within 50m of road edge to allow for easy maintenance access

## Separated Trail

(where R.O.W permits and separated trail is desirable - to be determined locally)

- separated trails are required to connect with main trail before junction

## Fencing

- both sides of trail, minimum 100m back from access barrier (both sides of corridor)
- in cooperation with adjacent

## Rock Barriers

- to restrict unauthorized use

## Lockable Gate

- with galvanized steel frame to resist unauthorized access
- refer to fig. 3.7 & 3.8

## Trail Sign

- stop (RA-1)

## Trail Signage

- type D sign - refer to fig. 4.1
- trail name, permitted and non-permitted users, rules of trail, emergency contact number and distance marker

## Access Barrier Setback

- to match adjacent property lines

1.5m | Min. 3.0m

## Rock Barrier

- on both sides of access barrier to prevent unauthorized access

(To accommodate snowmobile and equestrian use)

(Or to accommodate OFSC groomer)

## Access Control Barrier

- Design to be sympathetic to surroundings (eg. wood fencing rural area)
- refer to fig. 3.7, 3.8

## Crossing

- centre line of trail to be aligned on both sides of road
- crossing to be as close to perpendicular to road as possible
- maintain open sight triangle, free from obstruction
