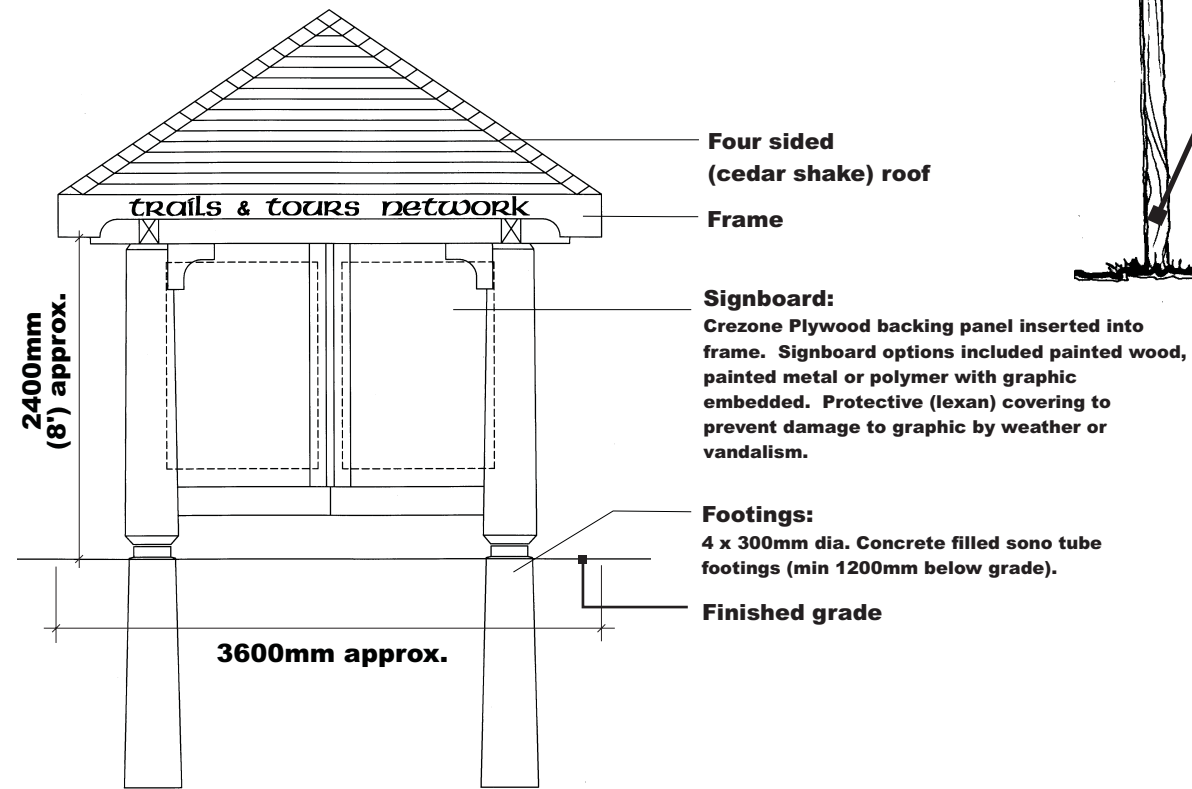


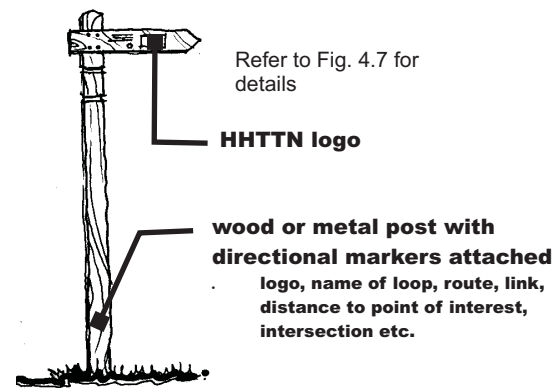
Trail Signing - General Sign Types

Type A Sign: Motorist Sign/Gateway Kiosk

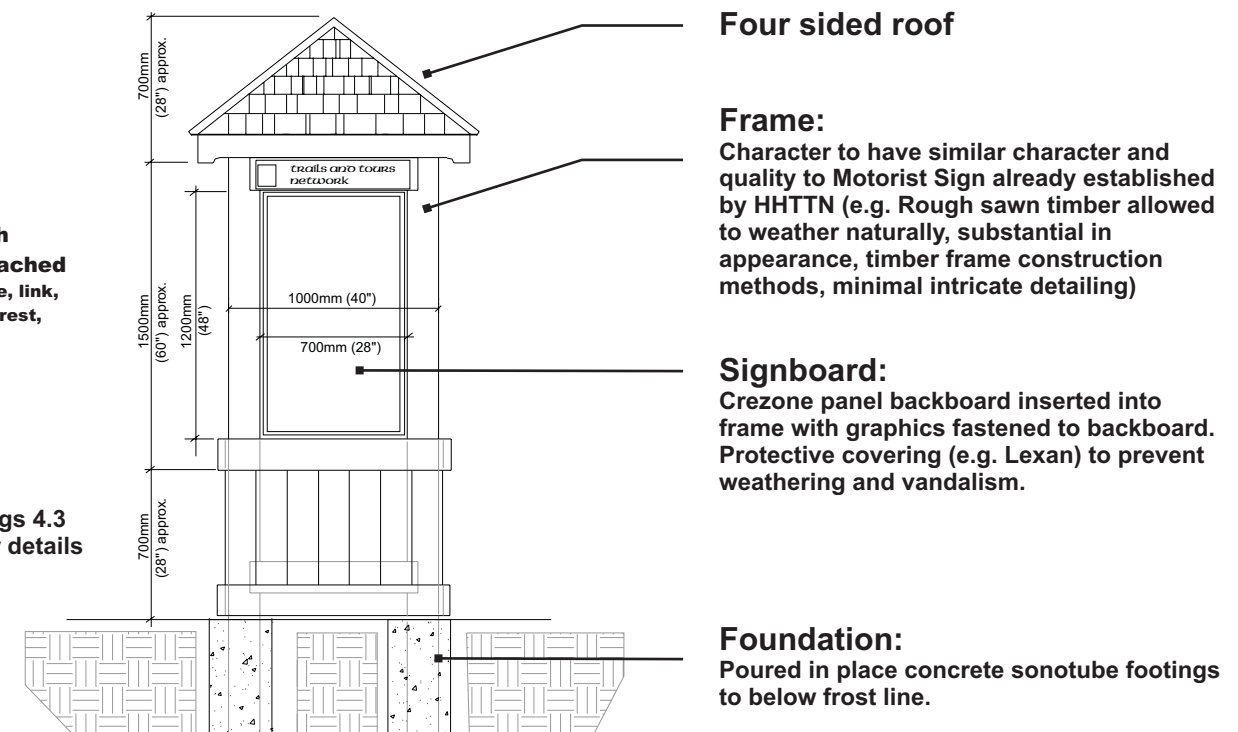


Type C Sign: Directional Sign

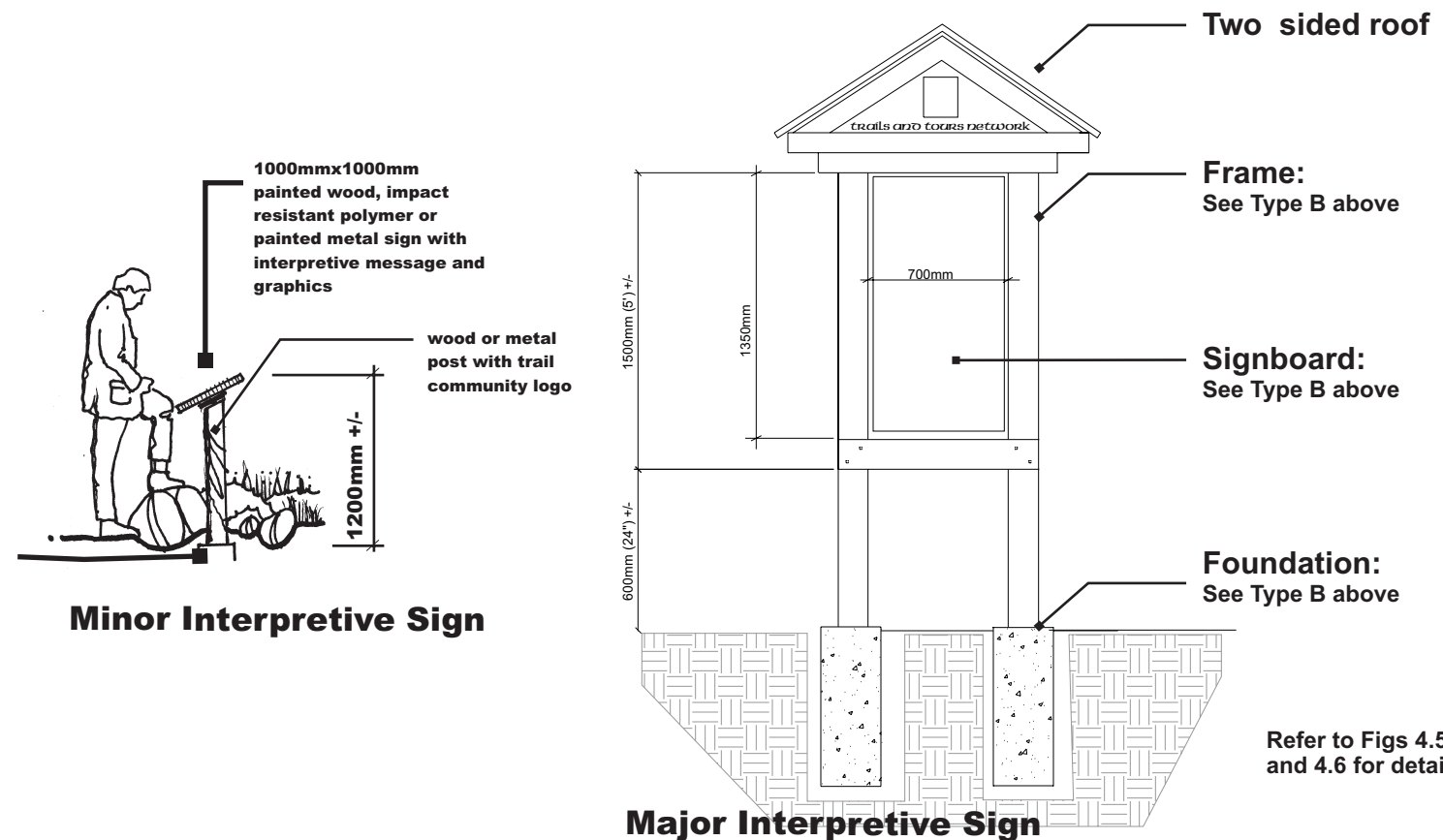

Notes:

1. These sketches are intended to convey the hierarchy of signs and design elements, not necessarily the design. It is suggested that a signing "system" be developed that uses consistent materials, graphics and details, so that all of the signs appear to be from the same "family".
 2. It is suggested that all traffic control signs (regulatory) associated with all off-road trails conform to standards in the "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Canada: Sign Pattern Manual", developed by the Transportation Association of Canada (TAC).
- Note:** In similar projects, off road signing sizes have been reduced to approximately 75% of the required sizing for on-road signing.
3. Any on-road bikeway signing and pavement marking must conform to the standards depicted in the Bikeway Traffic Control Guidelines for Canada, 1999.
 4. For roadside signage refer to text under "TOPS" signage (Transportation Association of Canada www.tac-atc.ca).

Type D Sign: Trail Marker

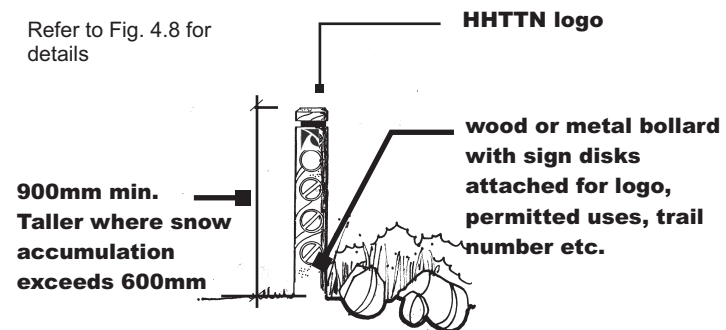
